## GENERAL INFORMATION

Greetings,

50th birthday! In January, at the Board of Mayor and Alderman, our Mayor through formal Proclamation dedicated this year to celebrate our 50th. In April we had our birthday party. It was awesome! At this event Senator Kerry Roberts presented us with a Proclamation honoring our 50th Birthday from the State Legislature and signed by Governor Lee. We handed out at least 500 cupcakes!! We look forward to celebrating with two more events and winding up the year with the 50th themed Christmas Parade.

The new Community Event Center has had delays due to weather and getting the steel on site. We have given an 80-day extension, so our opening is now projected to be mid December. Many of you have asked about what we will do with the current Civic Center. As some of you had heard our building is sitting on ground that has some underground caverns. We are in the process of gathering more information to determine if we can build a new recreation center on the south side of our current gymnasium. Pending the study

we are putting into motion a four phase project. Phase one will be a demolition phase that will bring down all but the gymnasium and lobby area. A new parking lot will be added on the north side of the gymnasium. Phase two will be the design of the new Recreation Center. Phase three will be to construct the new recreation center. Phase four will be the demolition of the current gymnasium and to construct an extension of the parking lot on the north side of the building.

The recreation center will be two levels. The first level will have the ability to have three full size basketball courts. These court areas can be used for other sports such as volleyball. We have two racquetball courts, a game room, warming kitchen, couple of multi-purpose rooms, concessions, and maybe a climbing wall. The second level will have a walking track, and multi-purpose/meeting rooms. Some of this is subject to

change as we move into the full design phase. It has been very exciting being involved in the build out of the City Municipal Complex. We have been creating a center for all to participate from small children with the playground and splash pad to senior adults with the amphitheater and senior center in the Community Event Center. And of course I would be remised if I did not mention our Library and Café that serves us all.

For all the soccer fans, we hope to get the sixth soccer field built out this summer/ fall. It will be fully irrigated and lighted. If budget allows, we also will be providing lights to the remaining fields that are not currently lit. Our plan is to build a very large parking area that can accommodate hard surface for vehicles at practices, games, tournaments, and to host the Americana future carnivals.

We are in the beginning stages of the master plan design

for the Byrum Family Park that we acquired last summer. Wait to you see what the Leisure Services Board has planned for your recreational enjoyment on this beautiful farm! When we get the final draft, we will share it with you all. Until the next Word on White House stay safe and enjoy the warmer sunny weather.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT**



1. Leave pets at home. Dogs cool themselves by panting, which precipitates convection; that is, their panting exchanges warm body temperature for cooler air outside. If the outside air isn't significantly cooler than their body temp, their cooling system doesn't work and they can get heatstroke. Studies show that on a 75-degree day, temps inside a car (with windows cracked) can raise to 100 degrees in 10 minutes. Temps in dark-colored cars can rise, even more, reaching temps of 200 degrees! Is taking Fifi with you to the market worth risking her life? Didn't think so.

2. Keep plenty of freshwater accessible in deep bowls. All that heavy breathing takes a toll. Dogs lose moisture much faster than humans, so they should always have access to fresh, cool water. Deep bowls of cool water will stay chilled longer than shallow bowls, and you can also add ice to prolong the chill.

3. Avoid burnt paws. If the pavement is too hot for your bare feet, well guess what — it's too hot for your dog's paws. Always check the pavement before bringing your dog outside. If you can't avoid walking your dog across hot pavement, invest in a product that protects his feet. If your dog doesn't like the feel of protective coverings such as boots, try a topical product such as Musher's Secret, which creates a protective wax barrier between your dog's paws and any surface they touch.

4. Be sensible about exercise. \*Exercise early in the morning or late at night when the sun's intensity is less. Even then, watch for signs of heat stress, some of which can include: excessive panting, increased salivation, glassy eyes, and pale gums. To keep bored dogs occupied during the day, try making a "pupsicle". It will help keep your dog cool and occupied for hours. Check out our Pinterest board for more ideas.

5. Maintain their coat. A shaggy coat can actually help insulate your dog against the heat. If you have a thick-coated dog or cat, try FURminating them. The FURminator pet brush removes a thick undercoat while leaving the outer coat which insulates and protects their skin from sunburn. As long as air can circulate through the fur, this will help keep your pet cool.

6. Keep up on flea prevention. Ideally, your dog or cat should already be on a monthly flea preventative because it's much harder to eradicate fleas from your home after they've already started to reproduce. Flea larvae are practically bulletproof, and get this – -vacuuming actually encourages them to hatch! If you are nervous about using flea medications containing Fipronil and other ingredients, there are now all-natural lines you can try. Consult with your veterinary office for recommendations.

7. Do you suspect heatstroke? If you think your pet has overheated, place cool (not ice-cold, as this can do more harm!), wet washcloths on his head and neck, and cool compresses on his belly and under his back legs. Call your vet's office immediately and seek their advice about the next steps. Heatstroke can quickly lead to coma, cardiac arrest, and death, so don't hesitate to seek veterinary attention as soon as possible.

\*A brachycephalic (flat-faced) breed may have a harder time cooling themselves in hot weather. Owners of flat-faced breeds like pugs, bulldogs, boxers, Pekinese, etc. You should keep exercise to a minimum and take extra care to keep their dogs cool.

- Trail erosion, trail obstruction, graffiti, trail hazards: Call 615-672-4350, ext. 2114 White House Parks.
- Carry a cell phone in case of emergency.
   Program the White House Police Department's number into your cell phone before you leave.
- There is safety in numbers. Use the buddysystem and enjoy the trail with a companion.
- Park in a well-lit, heavily-trafficked area. Lock your vehicle and do not leave valuables such as purses, wallets, jewelry, or cell phones inside.
- Carry identification including your name, phone number, critical medical information, and a contact name/number in case of an emergency.
- Wear comfortable sport shoes, loose-fitting clothing appropriate for the weather, and use proper safety equipment. Wear bright and/or reflective fabrics and carry a whistle or noisemaker.
- Tell friends or family the route you will be taking and when you expect to return. If you are going to be late, give them a call.
- Stay on the designated trail and avoid shortcutting or crossing open country.
- Be alert and aware of your surroundings. Avoid areas where visibility is poor, and be aware of sounds in your environment.
- Be confident. Look people in the eye and let others know you are aware of their presence with a polite "Hello!"
- When you approach your car, have your key ready. Check the floor and back seats before you get in.


## Stay fire safe this summer! Follow these grilling safety tips.

Clean your grill after each use. This will remove grease that can start a fire.




Place the coals from your grill in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.
